



Caplan-Lieber Human Relations Scholarship Award Nominee Essay Guidelines

Congratulations on being nominated by your organization for the 2024 Caplan-Lieber Human Relations Scholarship Award. Since 1955, the Pittsburgh Area Jewish Committee (PAJC), a non-profit human rights organization, has recognized high school students who have shown initiative and leadership in combating prejudice and fostering good human relations between diverse groups within the school and/or community.

A panel of judges will review the applications and select one student to receive a \$5,000 scholarship and the winner's school will receive \$500 to continue your good works.

In order to be considered for this award, you must submit:

A **two to three page (double spaced) essay** about your initiative and leadership in combating prejudice and fostering good human relations between diverse groups within the school and/or community.

Please use the questions below to help guide you in writing your essay:

- Describe the specific projects, activities or efforts in which you have combated prejudice and fostered good relations between diverse groups within the school and/ or community.
- What were the results of these projects, activities or efforts? Please be specific.
- Did you engage others to combat prejudice and foster good relations between diverse groups within the school and/or the community. How?
- What motivated you to undertake this specific project?
